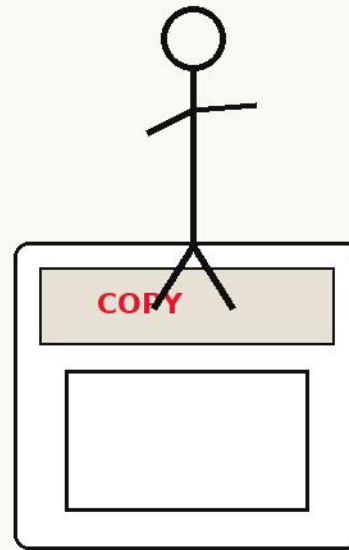

Steal the setup. Make it yours.



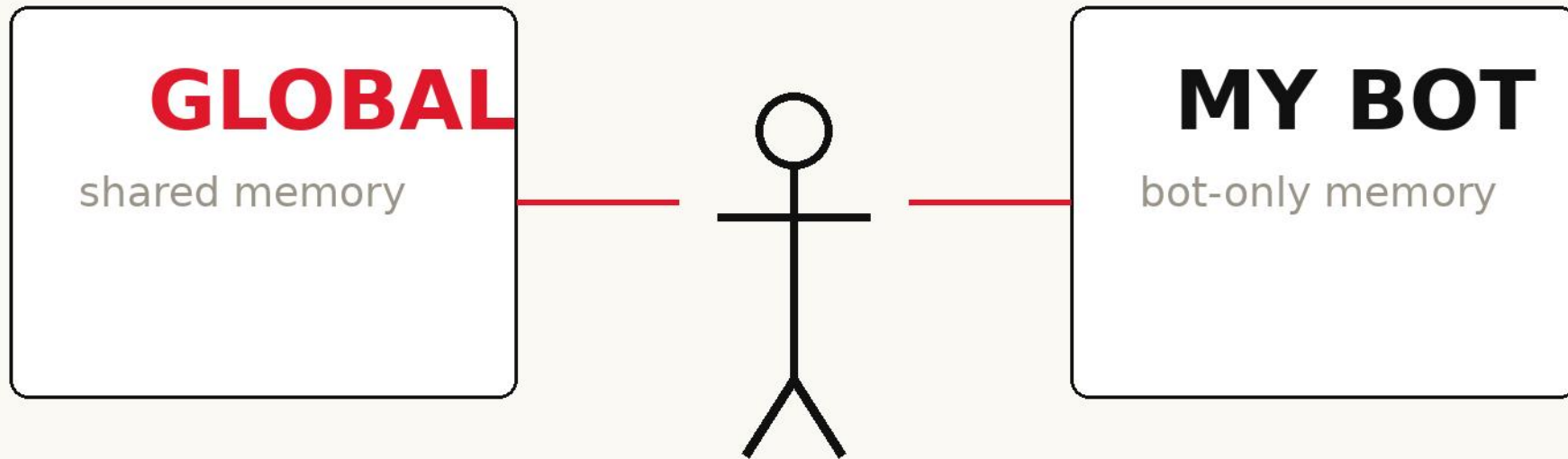

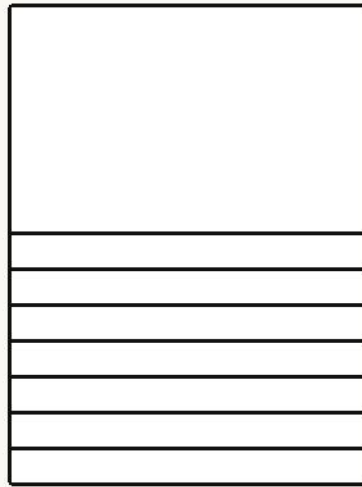
4. Context + memory

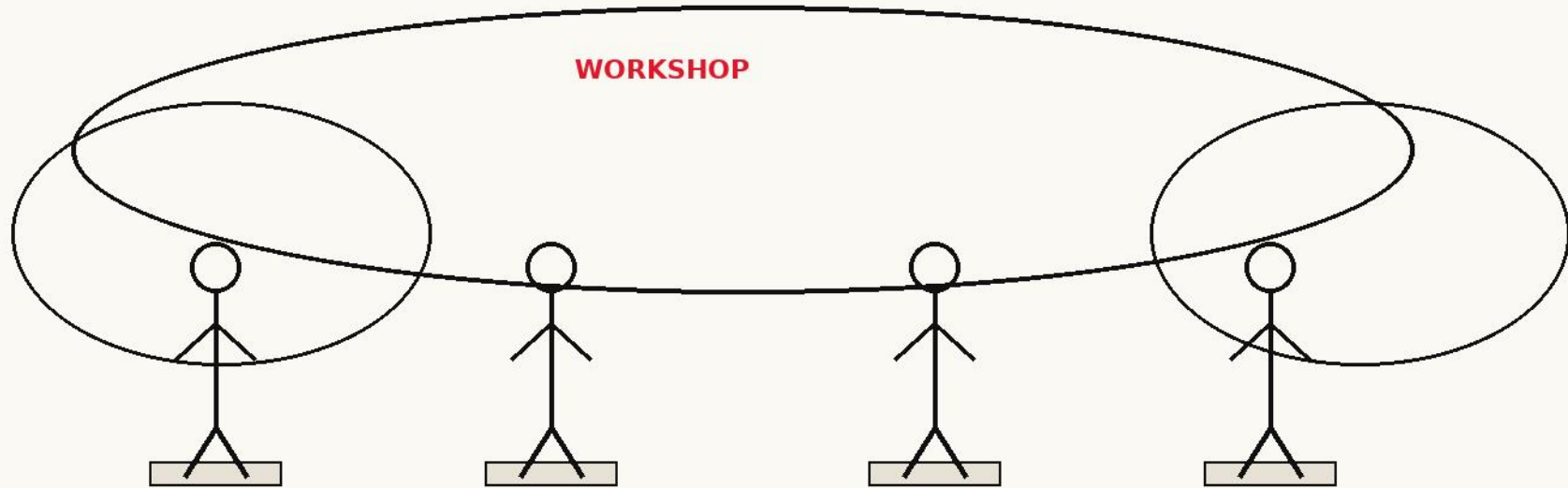

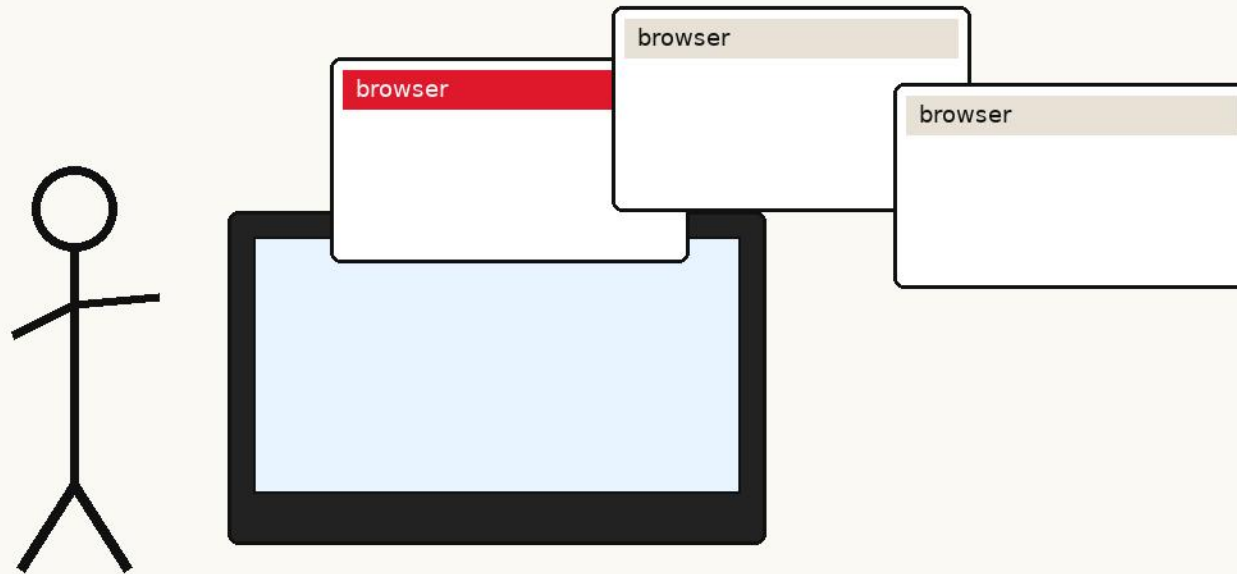
6. Agent computer

Same workshop. Different desks.



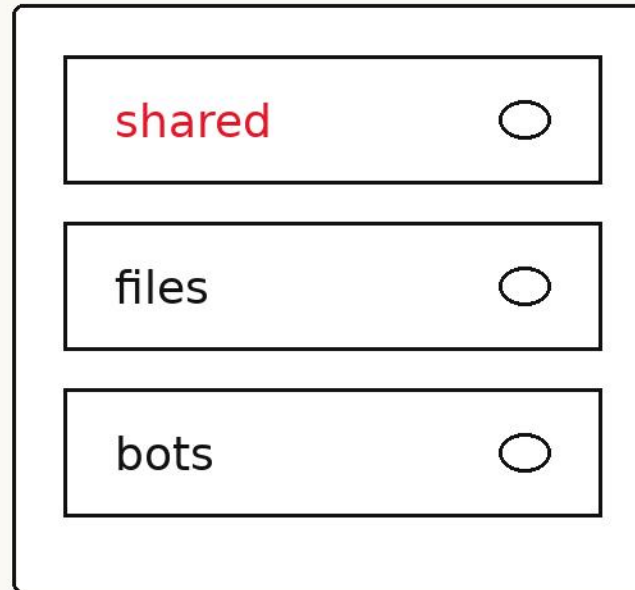
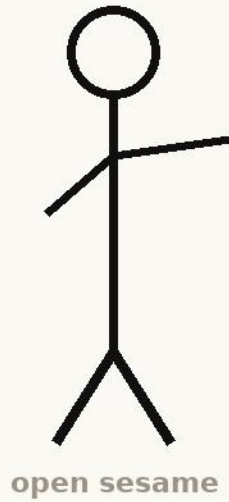
7. Browser

9. Terminal

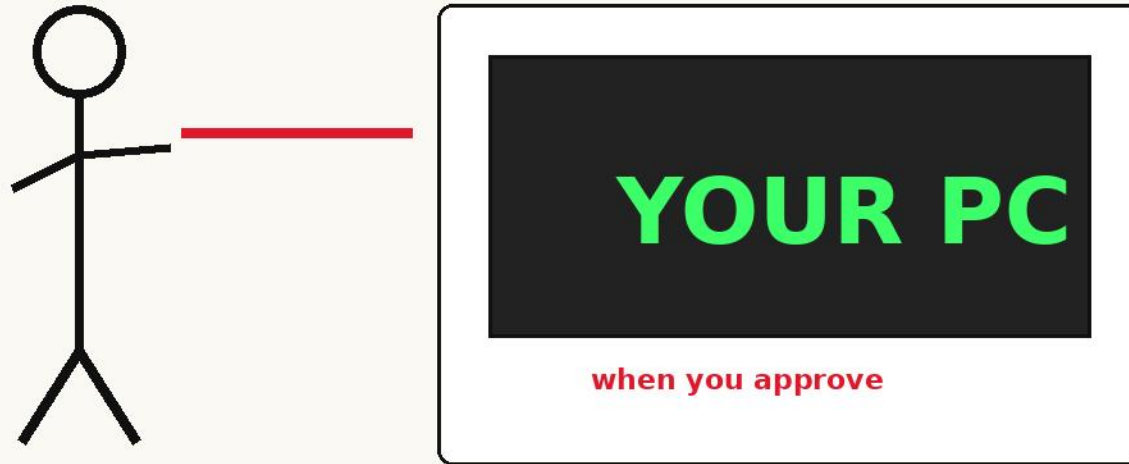
A real computer — run commands and scripts.

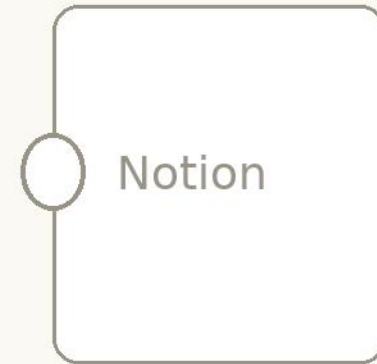
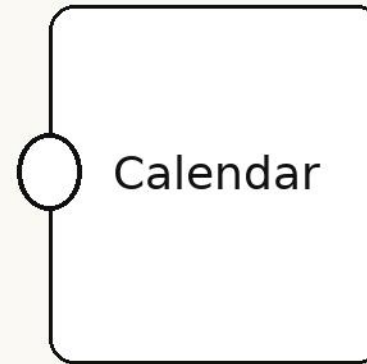
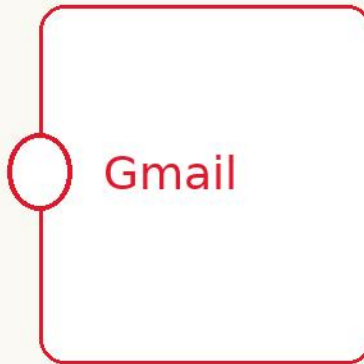
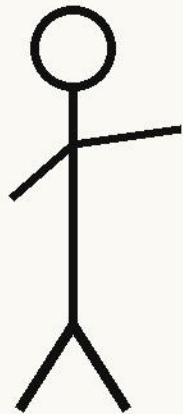
10. Local file access

Reusable playbooks. Do it twice? Make a skill.

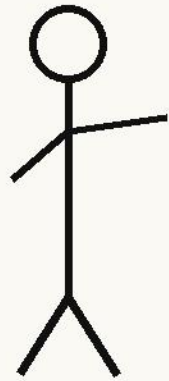

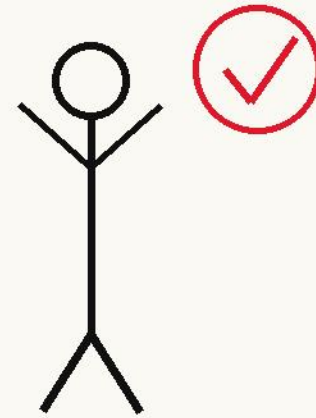
13. Teach a task

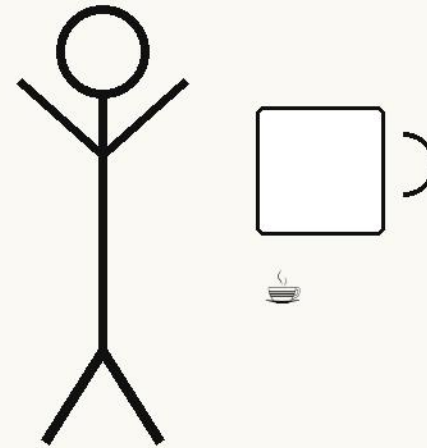
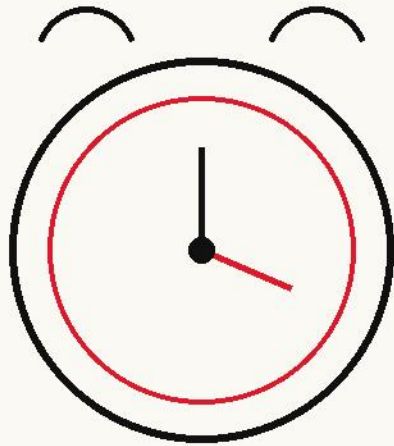

14. Routines

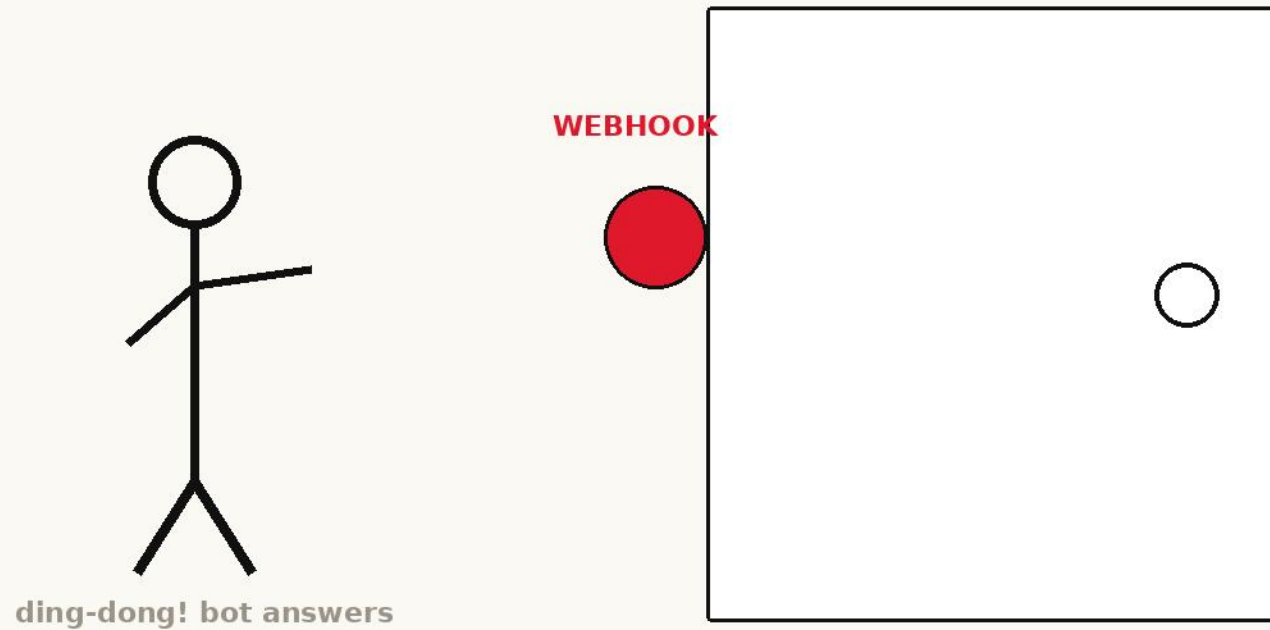
Schedule or event → the bot runs the skill.



schedule / event → run skill

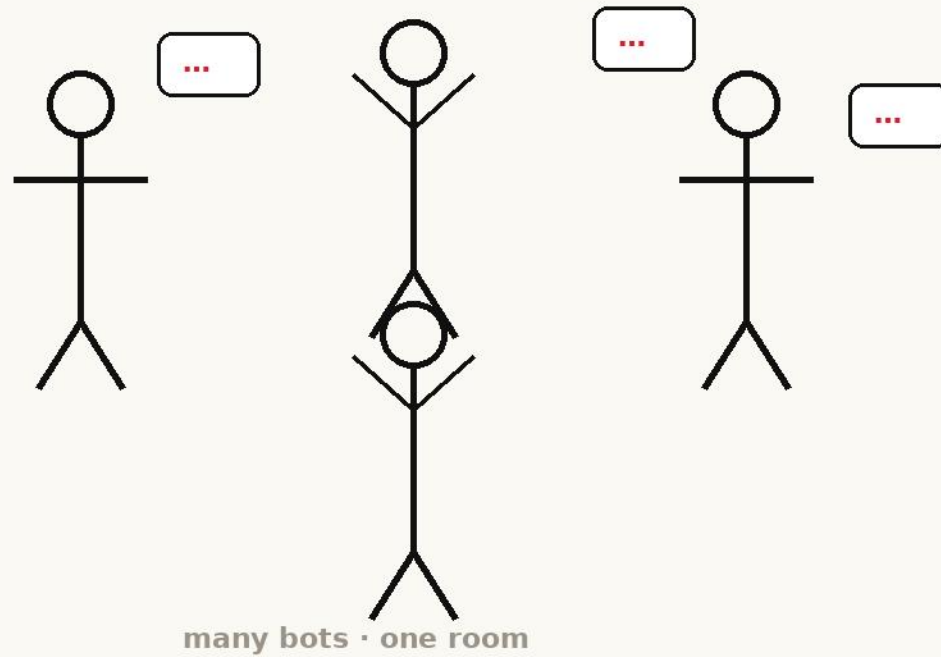
15. Webhooks

Routines are the clock. Webhooks are the doorbell.



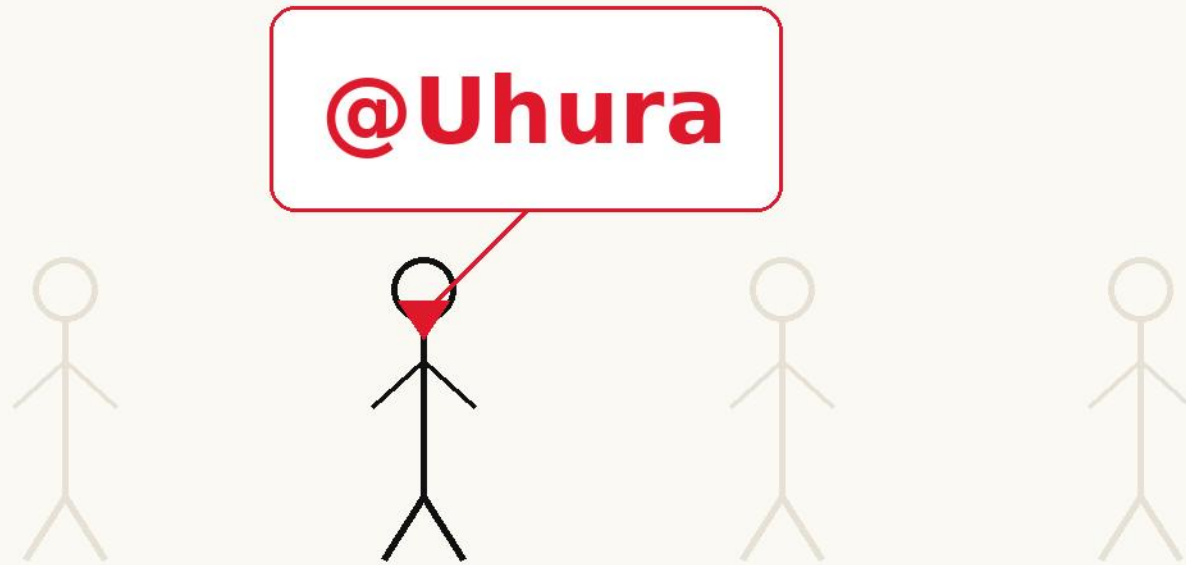
16. Group chats

Multiple bots in one room.



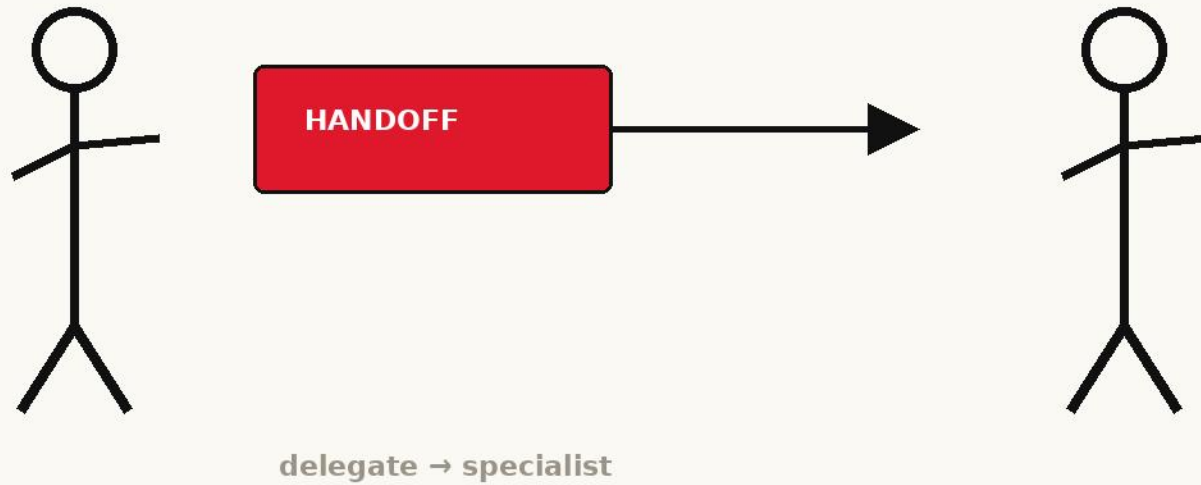
17. Mentions (@bot)
